





Summary notes

In 2025 Q1, double-digit house price increases were observed on both an annual and a quarterly basis in Budapest

- In Budapest, house prices were up by 11.7 per cent in 2025 Q1 compared to the previous quarter bringing the annual growth rate to 22.3 per cent.
- In cities outside Budapest, prices grew by 6.7 per cent in 2025 Q1 with annual price growth amounting to 13.9 per cent.
- In municipalities, there was a price increase of 2.2 per cent in Q1, bringing house prices 10.0 per cent above the levels seen relative to a year earlier.
- Hungarian residential prices were up by 7.0 per cent in 2025 Q1, while prices rose by 15.3 per cent in annual terms.








Chart 2 Nominal MNB house price index by type of settlement (2015 average = 100%)




Chart 3 Changes in house prices in cities between 2024 Q1 and 2025 Q1 (growth between 2023 Q4 and 2024 Q4)

Detailed description of underlying developments

According to new MNB house price index data, the annual growth rate of house prices accelerated in all types of settlement in 2025 Q1. On a quarterly basis, in 2025 Q1, house prices rose by 11.7 per cent in Budapest after the price growth of 3.9 per cent seen in 2024 Q4. As a result, annual house price dynamics accelerated from 14.1 per cent to 22.3 per cent in nominal terms. Outside Budapest, after the house price increase of 2.1 per cent in the previous quarter, prices rose by 6.7 per cent in the beginning of 2025, resulting in a pick-up in price growth from 13.5 per cent to 13.9 per cent. In municipalities, following the stagnation observed in 2025 Q4, prices rose by 2.2 per cent in 2025 Q1; however, the growth rate of house prices slowed down from 16.1 per cent to 10.0 per cent in annual terms.

On a quarterly basis, house prices rose at an accelerating pace in all regions in 2025 Q1. The most pronounced quarterly price increase was observed in the cities in Northern Hungary (+9.3 per cent), while prices in the cities in South Transdanubia rose by 8.7 in 2025 Q1 following the price correction in 2024 Q4. In 2025 Q1, prices increased by 7.5 per cent in the cities in the Northern Great Plains, by 6.0 per cent in the cities in Western Transdanubia, by 5.2 per cent in the cities of the Southern Great Plains. In the cities of Pest County experienced a relatively more moderate price increase of 2.1 per cent. In most regions, annual house prices rose by 13-16 per cent, with single-digit house price dynamics only in the cities of Pest County (+7.8 per cent), and the largest annual house price increase (+16.8 per cent) occurred in the cities of Southern Transdanubia.

Based on the aggregated MNB House Price Index for Hungary, presenting the national average of developments in house prices, the quarterly growth of 2.2 per cent in 2024 Q4 was followed by a growth of 7.0 per cent in 2025 Q1. The annual nominal growth rate of house prices accelerated from 14.3 per cent in the previous quarter to 15.3 per cent in 2025 Q1. In real terms, annual house prices rose by 9.6 per cent in Hungary.

Note:

As the compilation methods applied are not fully identical, there may be a difference in the national House Price Index published by the HCSO and the MNB.
